TITLE – AREA Textile Design (Advanced Level)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course will be a creative unique experience into today's textile world: technical aspects, material knowledge, weaving basis, creativity, upcycle.

The first part of the course will focus on the **materials**. Production process from fiber, to yarn, to fabric for the main textile categories: worsted wool, woolen wool, denim, nylon, linen, silk. Composition, structures, processes to produce responsible fabrics, with a focus on made in Italy, hosting professional special guests who will share their passion for textiles. The partner companies will supply their left overs to allow students to touch and feel the products.

For each product category there will be a focus on **final aspects**: dying, finishings, prints, embroidery, laser, devorè, treatments, manipulations.

After becoming more aware of what is necessary to make a textile expert do its job from a practical perspective, the course will allow each student to design his/ her own concept, expressing their creativity putting **hands on product**.

Starting from a moodboard, students will be guided into transforming the materials (yarns and fabrics) into a textile capsule collection.

The entire project with its process will be documented and shared with the companies that supplied the leftovers. We will offer a new perspective. Tangible feedback. A visible and touchable contamination. Old and new. Upcycling as a bridge between cultures and generations.

The course will allow students to learn how to communicate their ideas, how to talk to textile experts. They will learn the basics and become aware of what they do not know, so that they can ask to right master. Knowing what we do not know is a form of intelligence.



COURSE OBJECTIVES

The course aims at providing students with knowledge about technical textiles for further research and practical testing. Students will learn to evaluate the most appropriate techniques to be applied to a fabric and how to develop a concept in a small collection of tissues, starting from a personal theme.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This course is designed for final-year university students and for those with some working experience in the field of fashion, who wish to explore new opportunities combining strategy and creativity.

OUTPUT

At the end of the course students will be familiar with the following concepts:

- textile supply chain and textile districts in Italy: from fiber to fabric;
- textile fibers: classification, characteristics, aspects;
- fabric technical sheet: warp, weft, weight, height, straight/ reverse, patterns, compositions and maintenance.
- final aspects: dying, finishing, prints, embroidery, laser, devorè, treatments, manipulations.
- creativity: collection structure, research, design, sampling, go to market tools;
- workshop: weaving, dying, manipulation, printing
- communication: how to explain a creative concept.

LIST OF MATERIALS AND TOOLS

Pencils, scissors, cutters, scotch tape, glue, transparent acetate sheets, rubber gloves, any creative material at student's choice.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Class attendance is required for successful completion of the course. Attendance will be taken every class period. On the last day of classes, **instructors will issue a Certificate of successful attendance only to all students who completed at least 80% of the course**.
